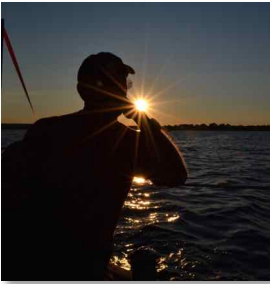

Class Updates

Our JN class spent most of December working

on their final exam, so you can bet they've been celebrating the Holidays this year after everything Jim Morris and I have put them through as their instructors. I'm hoping we will receive the results in the next few weeks. Great job, JN students!

Radar for Boaters Class

A brand-new elective course has been released by America's Boating Club entitled, *Radar for Boaters*. We will be offering this class beginning at the end of January in an online format so you won't have to worry about venturing out into the cold or, if you happen to be one of our migratory members, you can still attend from your snowbird location. Because the course is so new, you cannot register for it online, so you'll have to contact me to get onto the class. Be quick about it, though, because I need to order the textbooks in the next couple of days so that they can get to you in time.

Piloting Class

Our outgoing and incoming SEOs have organized a Piloting class to begin in mid-February. This is the introductory course for learning marine navigation and is a prerequisite for all other navigation courses. It's only offered every other year, so sign up now if you're interested!

Celestial Navigation Class

In July we will kick off Navigation, the second half of our celestial navigation offerings. The new format we tried with JN in 2018 worked out well, so we'll be repeating the formula this year. Students will do all of their field work making celestial observations during the summer and fall before the weather gets too unpleasant, and then we will retreat to the classroom beginning in September to finish up before the Holidays in December.

Final Thoughts

This column will mark my last as your squadron's assistant educational officer. In April I will assume the role of District Educational Officer. That job promises to take up enough time that I won't be able to focus on the Finger Lakes Chapter to the degree it deserves.

No worries. I am confident that you will be in capable hands with

Charlie Fausold and John Flick taking the educational helm as SEO and ASEO, respectively. Both are ready to inject some fresh ideas and viewpoints into our educational program. After 14 years of direct involvement with Seneca's educational efforts, I think a change like this will be good for our local chapter.

If you're looking forward to not hearing from me again, I'm sorry to disappoint, as I'll still have an active role both here and at the District level. I'll still be your newsletter editor and webmaster, as well as continuing to teach classes when I have the opportunity, so I'll be around and accessible.

Upcoming Classes & Seminars

New! Radar for Boaters

Starts January 31st, 2019

Welcome to *Radar for Boaters*. Developed by Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons, this course is up to date for radar technologies available now and into the near future. The course covers the different types of radar equipment, their capabilities and limitations, as well as their features and how they apply to students' needs. It covers what you need to know about radar, from how and where to mount the antenna to how to interpret the displays, so you can use your radar for collision avoidance and for navigational purposes.

When: Thursdays beginning January 31st, 7:00-9:00 p.m.

Duration: 5-6 weeks.

Where: Online. *You will need a computer running the Chrome browser, or a tablet or phone running the Jitsi Meet App to participate in the online classes. Both Google Chrome and Jitsi Meet are free downloads.*

Prerequisites: Piloting. (Advanced Piloting recommended.)

Instructor: Tom Alley

Course Cost: \$105 (USPS members), \$41 (add'l family members), \$170 (nonmembers)

NOTE: *This course is so new that you cannot register for this class via the usps.org web site. You will need to contact the instructor directly to sign up for this class.*

*You must register by **January 6th** in order to get your textbook in time for the beginning of class.*

Piloting

Starts February 13th, 2019

Piloting is the key navigation class.

Learn the essentials of safe coastal and inland navigation using basic GPS in conjunction with charts and other marine data. The Piloting course teaches you how to use the GPS along with traditional dead reckoning techniques for planning and laying out safe routes, as well as ensuring that you are on-course while underway.

When: Wednesdays, 7-9pm

Duration: 9 weeks

Where: Watkins Glen Public Library

Prerequisites: None.

Lead Instructor: Charlie Fausold

Course Cost: \$90 (USPS members), \$32 (add'l family members), \$125 (nonmembers)

Operations Training

Spring 2019

It's a bit of a dry title, but this seminar will introduce you to how America's Boating Club is organized and how things get done. All members are invited to take this course, but those who currently hold office or serve on a committee are strongly recommended to sign up for this.

Boat Handling

Starts early May 2019

Formerly known as the Seaman-ship class, this course has just received a major overhaul as part of the overall restructuring of the Advanced Grade courses.

The Boat Handling course consists of six, two-hour seminar sessions. These sessions include an overview of USCG rules (COLREGS), PowerPoint slides, videos and animations. Best of all, several of the sessions will be held on the water, aboard real boats where you can practice what we cover in the classroom.

Boat Handling is also the first of the Advanced Grade courses to have its textbook in a digital (eBook) format.

Completion of all six seminars along with passing a comprehensive written examination will result in the award of the grade of "Seaman" (S).

Don't have time for the whole class? Then take advantage of the new format and structure and just sign up for the sessions you are interested in!

When: May-June 2019

Duration: 9 weeks

Where: Watkins Glen

Prerequisites: None.

Lead Instructor: Tom Alley

Course Cost: \$70 (USPS members), \$22 (add'l family members), \$110 (nonmembers)

This course has limited seating due to its on-the-water component. Priority will be given to students who sign up early. Also, students enrolling for the entire course will be given priority over those signing up for selected sessions.

Stargazing 101

Summer or Early Fall

How often have you looked up into the sky and wondered what you were looking at? Is that a star? A planet? Or just an airplane?

This seminar will provide you the basic skills you need to begin identifying common constellations and some of the specific bodies used for traditional offshore navigation. It will help you figure out where to look to find specific objects like the Andromeda Galaxy or the Polaris, the North Star.

Best of all, this seminar is open to the public. You are encouraged to bring your family and invite all your friends.

Seating is limited to 75 people and will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis.

There will be a nominal admission fee so that Corning Community College can cover its expenses for hosting us.

[As this issue went to press, it was learned that the Corning Community College Planetarium is scheduled to be refurbished and

remodeled in early 2019. As such, a reopening date has not been announced. Stay tuned for details. - Ed.]

Navigation

Starts July 2019

Following on the heels of our JN class, we will be offering the second part of the celestial navigation series this year.

Navigation is the class where students will hone their navigational skills to the pinnacle of traditional navigation – that of navigating by the stars.

Beginning this summer, we will take things out on the water and collect sextant observations of stars, planets, and the moon to accumulate enough data for everyone's "N" version of the sight folder.

Classroom sessions will begin in September and extend through December and will end with a two-week take-home examination.

All Navigation students are strongly encouraged to attend the "Stargazing 101" session described earlier in this column.

When: July-December 2019

Where: Watkins Glen Village Marina (OTW sessions). Classroom session location TBD.

Prerequisites: JN, Stargazing 101

Lead Instructor: Tom Alley

Course Cost: \$230 (USPS members), \$67 (add'l family members), \$375 (nonmembers)

Registration: This course is open to all USPS members, regardless of squadron/chapter affiliation. Contact the instructor, SEO, ASEO, or register online at <https://www.usps.org>.

Instructor Recertification

If you are a USPS Certified Instructor, then your certification must be renewed every four years. The good news is that it's easy to renew your certification by simply attending a 2-hour seminar.

Instructor Certification is a requirement for teaching any course where nonmembers (i.e., the general public) is present.

If your certification is expiring, or if you are interested in becoming certified, please contact any member of the Education Department.
